Here it is - the summer 2023 newsletter of Catoctin Presbyterian Church! There is timely information about upcoming events, so please take a look!

Summer is upon us! It is the glorious season of warmth, sunshine, gardens, growth, vacations, and relaxation. Except when it's cloudy, oppressively humid, too dry, or time to work. As with any season, it depends on who you ask as to whether it's a time of bane or blessing, and it's usually some of each.

On the blessing side around our church, the session has recently received several **new members** who will be received publicly soon, and we have a number of **new friends and visitors** who have been joining us in worship, all enriching our church family. 

In May, Pastor David led a study titled, "Honor God's Diversity". Dr. Justin Reed, assistant professor of Old Testament/Hebrew Bible at Louisville Theological Seminary, put together a four-session course to look at some of the basic biblical issues around diversity. This guided important conversation around what the Bible says about diversity and what diversity might mean for Jesus' followers today. Additionally, Pastor David led a four-week course in June titled, "Faith Sharing 101 for Reluctant Presbyterians".





#### Mission

**CPC** is called to feed the hungry. Feeding the hungry is close to our hearts and was singled out by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 25).

We do this year-round by supporting Loudoun Hunger Relief, Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, Mobile Hope, and the Community Coalition for Haiti. We also provide food and build food awareness through apple butter and blueberry jam sales, home-cooked meals for our congregation and community, Soup Sundays, Thanksgiving Bags, our Food Blessings Box, "blue box" food donations to Loudoun Hunger Relief, food drives at grocery stores, emergency funding for people in need, emergency gift cards for grocery store purchases, the CPC Farmer's Market, and many other ways.



September is **Hunger Action** Month. To increase awareness of how our church helps alleviate hunger, we are hosting a Haitian Experience lunch. Everyone in the community is invited to participate. See below for more details . . .

On September 17<sup>th</sup>, the **Community Coalition for Haiti** (CCH) will bring a **Haitian Experience** to CPC, surrounding churches, and friends and neighbors. *Everyone* is invited, including friends and neighbors. The mission committee will host a lunch following the worship service, during which we can learn more about making an impact in Haiti. Haiti is one of the poorest countries in the world



and has been racked by multiple earthquakes, hurricanes, and political turmoil. The CCH provides health care, food and nutrition training, and literacy programs to Haitian schoolchildren and their families. By bringing the Haiti Experience to CPC, we can hear about individuals who have struggled and been helped by the Coalition. This program will be a powerful, insightful, hands-on look at how we help the CCH change lives and extend the kingdom of God to the poorest of the poor. CCH is a strategic mission partner that we support financially throughout the year. Please save the date!

We are also making plans to host a program in September to prepare thousands of emergency meals for people in need around the world. We will be working with an international agency and will invite people in the community to join us in the work. It sounds like a colossal undertaking, but it should only take a couple hours on one morning! Arrangements aren't finalized, so keep watching for more information on this exciting and important mission outreach project.
