Dearly beloved in Christ,

I guess I shouldn't be surprised when I sit down to write to you and the world is in an uproar. I mean, the world is always in an uproar. Sometimes it seems worse than others, though. Maybe it's the start of the war between Israel and Gaza, with the shocking terrorist attacks by Hamas at the start and the brutal bombing in response by Israel. Maybe it's that this war opening reminds us that Ukraine and Russia are still at war, though many people seem to have forgotten. Maybe it's the mass shooting in Maine, taking its place among all the other mass shootings, with devastating loss of life and injuries, fracturing more families in another American town. Maybe it's that no one even seems to have the heart to go through the well-rehearsed arguments about gun violence again in its wake. Maybe it's the astounding dysfunction of the U.S. Congress. Maybe it's the fear-mongering attack ads leading up to the next election. Maybe it's the natural disasters, or the prejudice, or the weather, or the economy, or the economic disparity, or the anger, or the grief, or the vitriol, or the loss of civility, or

STOP!! Whoa!! Ssshhh. If you're like me, it is that easy to get caught in the swirl of bad news that pummels us from day to day. When that happens, I need to stop for a minute and get a grip.

We are making our way through Paul's letter to the Philippians in worship this month (October). He was writing from prison to a congregation that was feeling the backlash and oppression of their community in response to their newfound faith in Christ Jesus. I bet they were all feeling the swirl and bitterness of a world in uproar, and much closer than many of us feel it. In chapter 4, though, Paul wrote:

"Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again—rejoice! ... Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus."

The world is always in an uproar, but God is at work in the heart of it. We may feel like goodness is being swamped by evil, but Christ said the powers of hell won't prevail against the Church. When we feel overwhelmed, it's time to stop and return to the Word, the Christ. In Christ, God overwhelms the swirl with unimaginable peace. The Word brings order out of chaos, and the Word remains in perfect peace, even within the chaos. Breath. Pray. Find Christ in that still place in your soul, and you will not be swept away. Then together, in Christ, we bear witness to something greater in life than fear.




Fellowship Hour!



<u>Mission</u>

CPC is called to feed the hungry. Feeding the hungry is close to our hearts and was singled out by Jesus in the parable of the sheep and goats (Matthew 25).

CPC has a big heart for mission projects that help "the least of these." That's great because we have three initiatives planned and underway for November and December.

• Donating Hygiene Kits on an Interfaith Day of Service for Loudoun Hunger Relief, Sunday, November 19, sponsored by Loudoun Interfaith Bridges and Faith Leaders. Volunteers will pack hygiene kits for needy individuals that contain a bar of body soap, shampoo, conditioner, laundry pods, sanitary pads (no tampons), lip balm, hand sanitizer, lotion, and toothpaste/toothbrush. We will collect these items at CPC for this special project. There will be opportunities to sign up for donations, volunteer to pack the hygiene bags, or BOTH! Stay tuned - a Sign-up Genius will be coming your way soon.



The <u>Community Coalition for Haiti</u> is returning to CPC on <u>December 3 and 10</u> for an in-person alternative giving market called "<u>Gifts for Good</u>." Examples of alternative presents



you can give to Haitians on behalf of a friend, family member, or yourself include a health exam for a Haitian, a handwashing station for a family, or hygiene kits for girls. There are many possibilities because the need is so great. Plus, CCH is offering a special Haitian art option specifically for folks who purchase at the in-person market at CPC. They will also bring beautiful, hand-made star ornaments from Haitian artists to accompany the gift cards that describe your Gifts for Good.

 Learn more about <u>Tree of Life Ministries</u> on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 5</u>, when Susannah Lee, Regional Director for Purcellville, visits CPC to discuss Tree of Life's ministries, which include shelter, food, lifeskills, healthcare, and relief. CPC has recently become a supporting member of Tree of Life. Susannah will be here to provide an overview of this faith-based non-profit and

describe possible mission projects CPC could become involved with, including serving hot meals to families in need, and sponsoring clothing or food drives.





UPDATE: We recently received an email update on the 10,000+ meals we packaged for Rise Against Hunger in September. Those meals have been shipped to Madagascar! According to the email:

"Madagascar, an island nation off the southeastern coast of Africa, is home to over 28 million people. The nation faces high rates of poverty, food insecurity and chronic malnutrition. Especially in the southern part of the country, low access to education, water scarcity and frequent natural disasters cause severe food insecurity. The Global Hunger Index, which assesses food insecurity based on indicators that measure undernourishment and undernutrition, categorizes Madagascar as having an "alarming" level of hunger.

"To address some of the food security challenges that children, families, and communities in Madagascar face, Rise Against Hunger partners with organizations that support educational programs by providing meals to children at schools and early childhood development centers. This is a key part of Rise Against Hunger's Nourishing Lives pathway. In some cases, the food children receive at school will be the majority of the food they eat in a day. The meals you packaged will help ensure that children have access to the consistent nourishment they need to live healthy lives and successfully pursue their education. DEI at CPC

What is DEI? It stands for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. Last year the session adopted a statement about our intention to be a more inclusive congregation, to expand our sense of diversity, and to share the benefits of membership and leadership more consciously with those who have historically found themselves on the margins. We believe we are called to this work because our theology requires it. We believe that all humans are made in the Image of God, so all manner of humans should be included in the life, ministry, and leadership of the church. By the way, "Image of God" in Latin is "IMAGO DEI," so it's like diversity, equity, and inclusion are built in!

The short form of our DEI statement is, "In Christ, by the Spirit, we delight in all people." The long form goes into much more detail about what that means practically.
